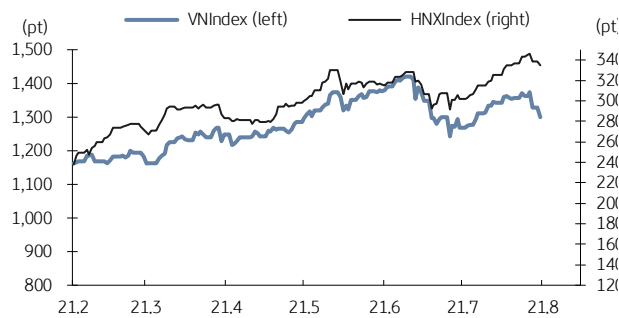

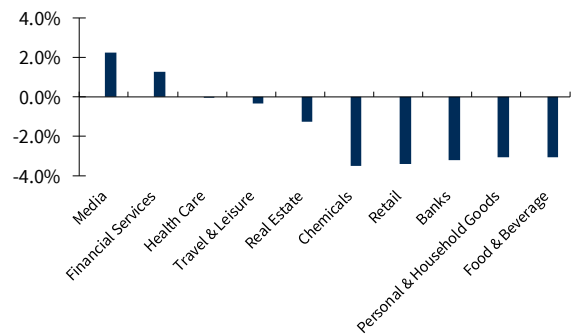
Stocks plummeted as the number of Coronavirus infections peaked, and Ho Chi Minh City applied tougher measures to control the disease. According to the General Department of Customs, Vietnam's fishery exports reached USD264 million (-30.1% YoY) in the first half of August, down 41% compared to the second half of July due to the COVID-19 pandemic due to the decrease in capacity from 30 -70%, making fishery stock Nam Viet Corp (ANV, -6.8%) and Vinh Hoan Corp (VHC, -5.7%) see sharp losses. Steel stocks Hoa Sen Group (HSG, -3.2%) and Hoa Phat Group (HPG, -3.1%) declined on sluggish steel production and consumption (2.4 million tons - down 6.46% MoM; and 2.1 million tons - equal to June 2021's, respectively). The Ministry of Agriculture and Rural Development said in the first seven months of the year, Vietnam exported nearly 3.5 million tons of rice and gained USD1.88 billion (down 12.69% in output and down 3.1% in value) amid the disrupted supply chain, which caused the price of Loc Troi Group (LTG, -5.3%) to drop. Foreign investors netsold, focusing on Diamond ETF (FUEVFVND, -0.8%), Hoa Phat Group (HPG, -3.1%) and Masan Group (MSN, -5.1%).

VN Index & HNX Index



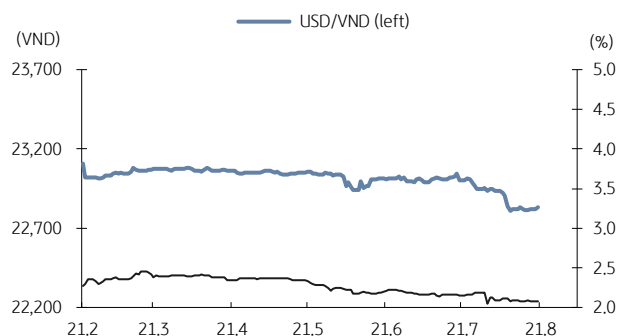

VN Index sector performance



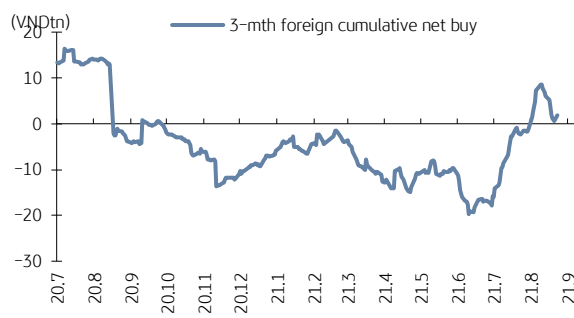

Vietnam - 3-mth cumulative net foreign buy



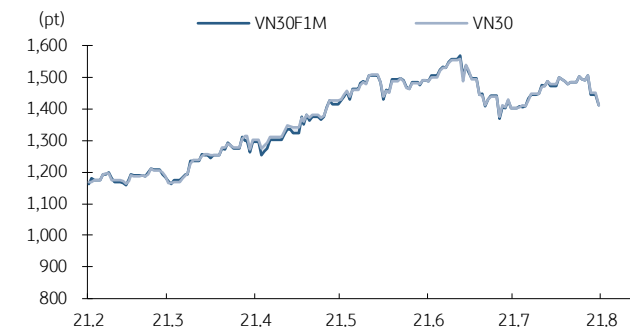

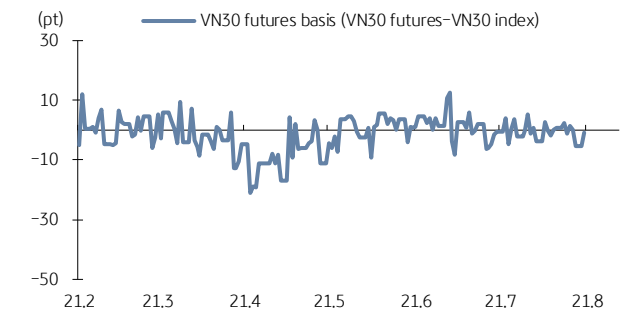

VN30 futures & VN30 index



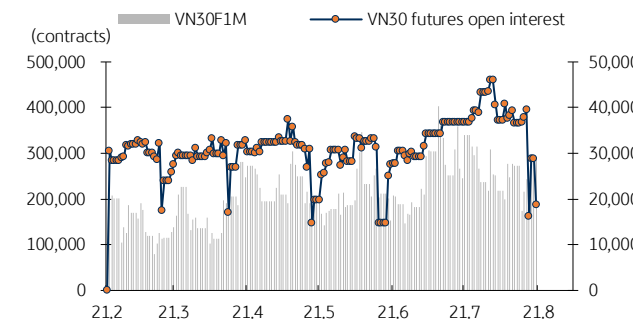

Front month VN30 futures basis



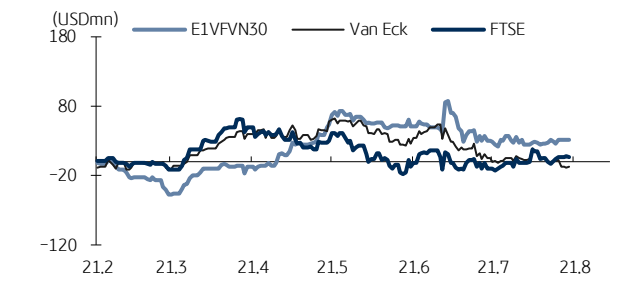

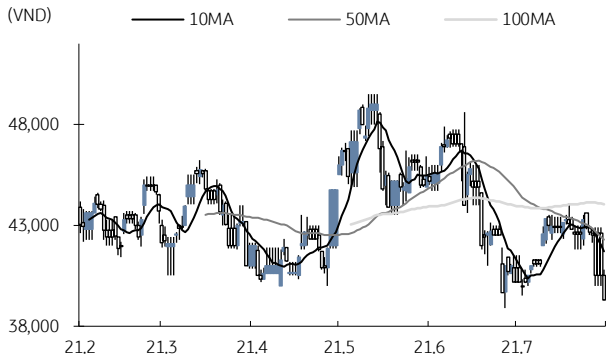
Vietnam ETFs - 3-mth cumulative net buy

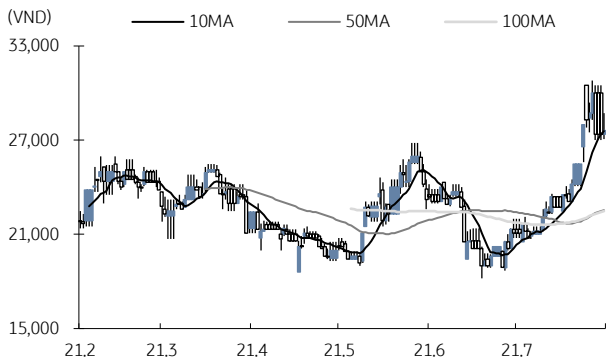

- BID closed down 3.0% to VND 39,300
- BID issued VND500 billion in eight-year bonds to increase the bank's operating capital.
- Those are a non-convertible, warrant-free, unsecured bonds with a floating interest rate equal to the reference interest rate plus 0.9% per year. The interest rate for the first period is 6.54% per year.

- TNG expects to 6.4 million shares to pay stock dividend for 2020 performance at the rate of 8% in 3Q or 4Q.

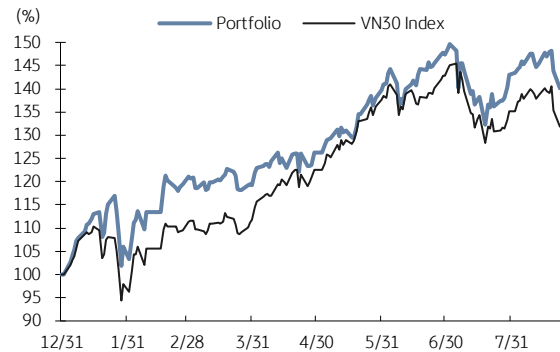
