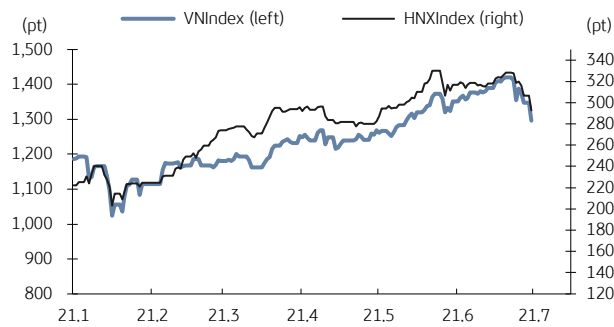

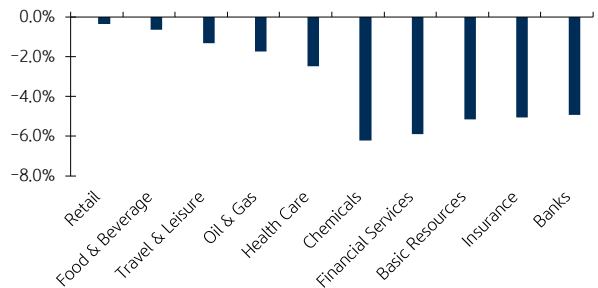
The VNIndex collapsed as Hanoi announced to suspend non-essential business activities from July 13 to halt the spread of the Coronavirus. Oil and gas stocks like PV Technical Services (PVS, +3.8%) and PV Drilling (PVD, +2.7%) gained when oil prices stayed high, triggered by concerns over the energy demand outlook amid emerging Delta variant and the unresolved deadlock between Saudi Arabia and the UAE. The State Bank asked banks to consider reducing lending rates for outstanding loans, which led to big losses in VietinBank (CTG, -6.9%) and Bank for Investment & Development (BID, -6.5%). Power shares Quang Ninh Thermal Power (QTP, +3.8%) and Halcom Vietnam (HID, +2.8%) outperformed today. Foreign investors netbought and focused on Sacombank (STB, -2.4%), SSI Securities (SSI, -5.9%) and Hoa Phat Group (HPG, -5.0%).

VN Index & HNX Index



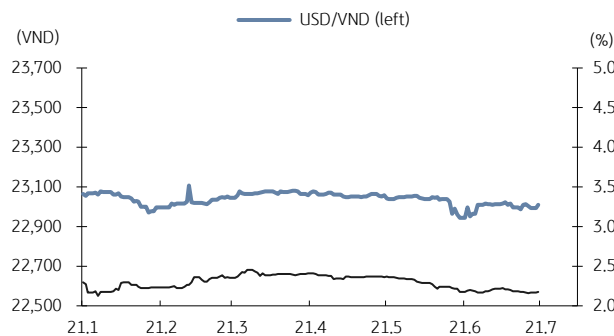

VN Index sector performance



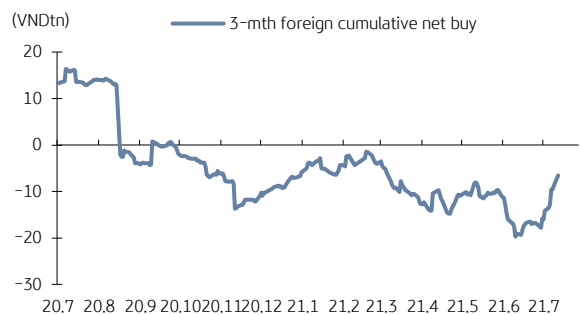

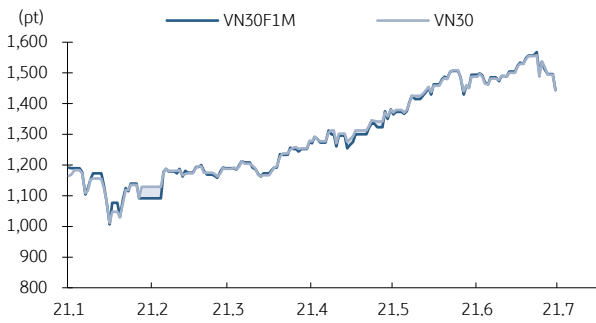

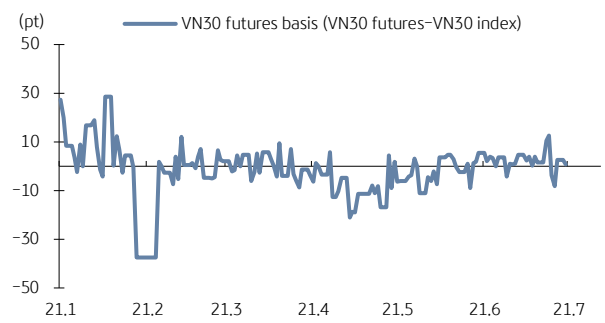

VN30 futures & VN30 index



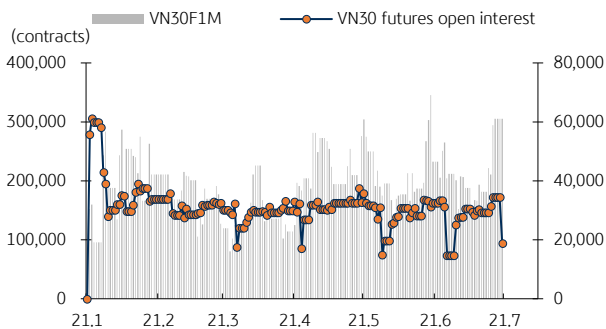

Front month VN30 futures basis



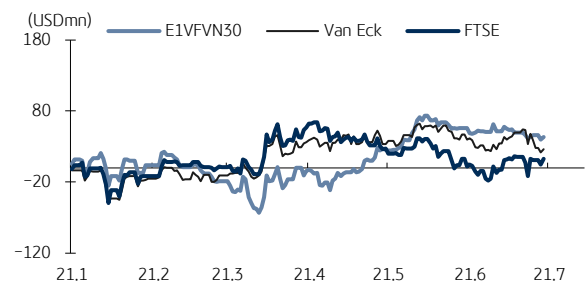

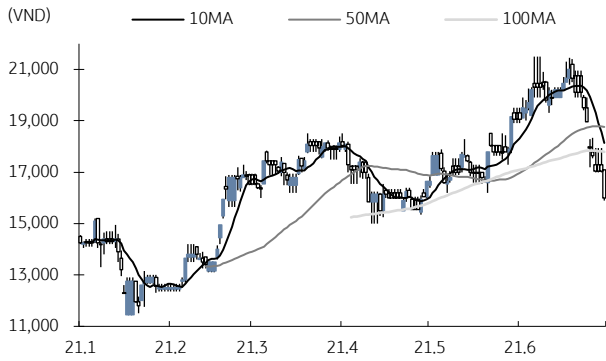
Vietnam ETFs - 3-mth cumulative net buy

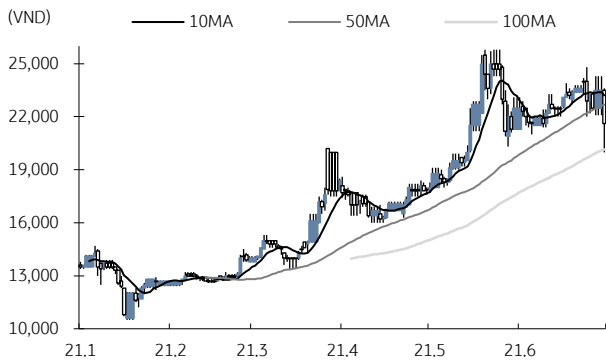
## PV Ca Mau Fertilizer (DCM)

- DCM closed down 6.2% to VND16,000
- DCM reported 2Q pre-tax earnings of VND 250 billion (-11% YoY), revenue of VND2,432 billion (+24% YoY), and sales volume of 205 thousand tons (-19% YoY).
- The plant's operating capacity in 2Q is over 110%, enough to offset the output shortfall in 1Q caused by raw gas shortage.

- ABB closed down 7.7% to VND21,600
- ABB announced 1H21 earnings at VND1,164 billion (+85% YoY) and credit growth of 6.4%.
- Earlier, the State Bank allowed ABB to increase its charter capital by VND3,696 billion or 65% to VND10,000 billion.

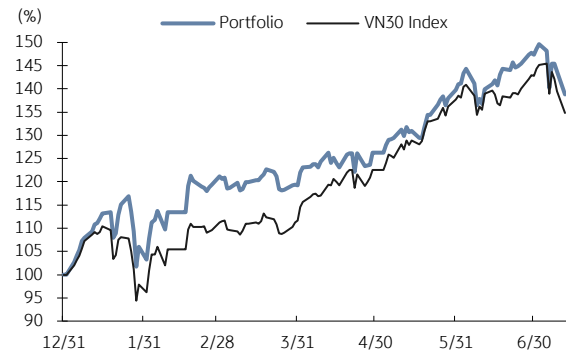
